<u>Drawing Conclusions/Inference</u>- using details to figure out what isn't stated directly

<u>Generalization</u>- a conclusion that is true of something *most* of the time, but not always.

<u>Idioms-</u> phrase that means differently than the meaning of the individual words (*battle such odds* - fight with little chance of success)
