#### Comprehension Skill and Strategy

Main Idea and Details - important ideas, what the text is mostly about

<u>Text Structure</u> - how a text is organized (cause & effect, problem & solution, chronologically/sequential order, compare & contrast)

<u>Onomatopoeia</u>- a word used to show what something sounds like (ie. whoosh, buzz)

**Decoding** breaking words into syllables review

1. Open syllable ends with the long vowel sound	ex. pre - serve, de-cline,
2. Closed syllable, closes in the vowel with a consonant so short vowel sound	ex. rec-og-nize,
3. When there is a VCCV split the two consonants	ex. dis-ap-pear, ef-fort-less
4. Vowel + r in multisyllable words	ex. card-board, cer-tain
5. Blends stay together in a syllable to form sound	ex. an-swer, east-ern
6. If letters are part of a prefix or suffix, keep those letters together	ex. un-sup-port-ed
