<u>Text and Graphic Features</u>- text features include headings, captions, boldfaced words. Graphic features include diagrams, charts, maps, and pictures.

Examples from the informational text			
Shows sequence of events using dates (major world events)			
Labels parts of a picture (Redwood tree diagram)			
Shows where things are (Location of Alexander's ancient empire)			

<u>Clarify</u> - reread and use resources to better understand a text

Figurative Language - A simile compares to unlike things using the words like or as.

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Decoding - breaking VCCV words into syllables

When there is a VCCV split the two consonants, but if the two consonants are a blend or diagraph (th, ck, sh), the two consonants stay together

ex. meth-od, bick-er-ing, bash-ful-ness
