Comprehension Skill and Strategy

Story Structure- describe the elements of a story including characters, setting, and plot

Infer/Predict-use text clues to figure out what isn't directly stated by the author.

Decoding words with Digraphs-digraphs are letters that work together to make one consonant sound. These digraphs should not be separated when looking for syllables.

th, ch, sh, wh, ph, ck, ng

Suffix - words ending with -ous and -y

Suffix	Meaning	Example
-ous	full of, likely	dangerous (likely to cause harm)
-y	likely	Rocky (likely to have rocks)
